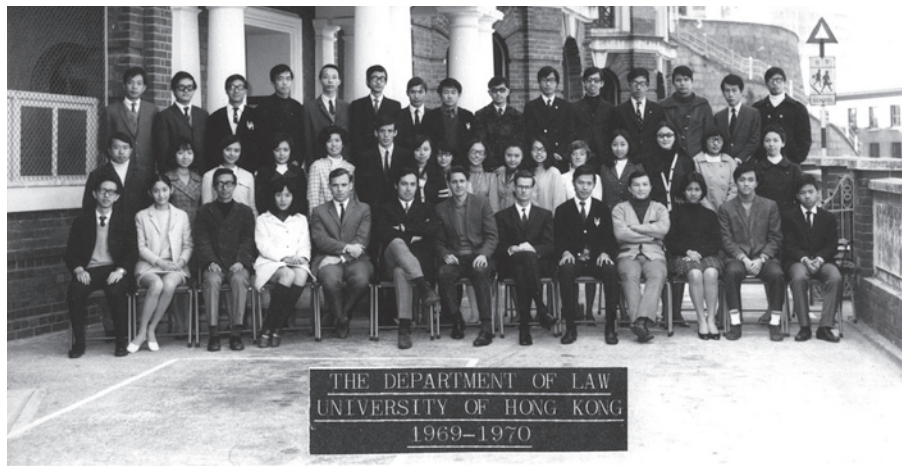

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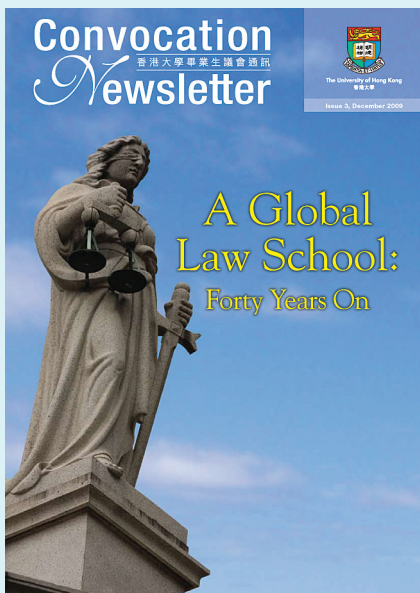

Law: Forty Years On

*F*orty years are almost half a century. The child who used to play on the streets is by now one of the many established professionals or community leaders of the same piece of land. Forty years can engender enormous transformation, both for the child and our Faculty of Law, which humbly started as a Department of Law in 1969 with only one undergraduate programme of about 40 students per year. It grew into the School of Law in 1978 and attained full Faculty status at The University of Hong Kong in 1984.

In 2009, the Faculty of Law is happily celebrating its 40th anniversary.

A Sense of

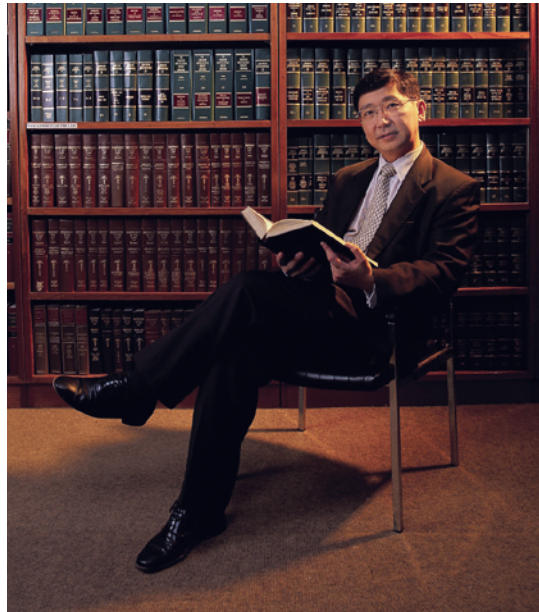
Forty years ago, we planted the seeds that have proved to be crucial to upholding the rule of law in Hong Kong. Today, we hope to plant another seed that would lead to the blossoming of a service culture among law students and the next generation of lawyers.

When the law school began its life 40 years ago, it had barely three teaching staff members and about 40 students. Forty years down the road, we have almost 80 teaching staff members and about 1,400 students.

We started off as a local law school with a single mission to nurture local lawyers. Now we can proudly say that we are among the best law schools in the world with a strong global reputation and a mission that transcends the vocational training of legal professionals.

This special occasion of our 40th anniversary is not just a time to look back at and celebrate what we have achieved. More importantly, it should be a time for reflection and forward planning – an intermission to ponder where we are going from here.

Forty years ago, China was at the height of the Cultural Revolution. In contrast, Hong Kong's economy was ready to take off, particularly its light industry. In anticipation of a greater demand for legal services, the University took the courageous step to establish the law school. In the following 40 years, we have produced not just eminent lawyers and judges, but also leaders in many different fields.

Mission

On the other hand, demand for legal services continues to grow. While there is no shortage of lawyers providing legal services in many specialised fields these days, there are still huge demands for legal services, in areas that are either ignored or just not lucrative enough to attract the attention of busy lawyers. Asylum seekers, scrupulous consumer trade practices, migrant workers, labour disputes, public housing and tenancy disputes, discriminatory practices, just to name a few.

We do have a great legal aid service, but it provides only legal representation. We also have a great Duty Lawyers Scheme which provides an advisory service, but it is a one-off advisory service that does not provide any follow-up action. *Pro bono* legal services are barely available.

In many well-developed common law systems, the university fills in this gap by providing *pro bono* legal services to the community. They may take different forms, but the essence is that the services are provided by law students under the close supervision of staff who are qualified for legal practice. These services provide an invaluable learning experience for students alongside a valuable service to the

community. They are invariably supported by the legal profession. Indeed, they could become a source of referral of works to the legal profession, as it is common experience that the more complex cases that come to such services are always referred to law firms that are willing to take up such cases. In the US and Canada, virtually every reputable law school runs a clinical programme providing such services. Many leading law schools in Australia have introduced such clinical programmes, and an increasing number of law schools in the UK have followed suit in recent years.

At our 40th birthday, it is high time for us to consider introducing this valuable service to the community. We have already run a successful pilot scheme at the Small Claims Tribunal. I am glad that the Judiciary, the Department of Justice, and the Bar Association are supportive of this initiative. Forty years ago, we planted the seeds that have proved to be crucial to upholding the rule of law in Hong Kong. Today, we hope to plant another seed that would lead to the blossoming of a service culture among law students and the next generation of lawyers. We have been bestowed with privileges and honour by the community in the past. It is time we give back in a small way to the community.

The 40th anniversary celebration of the Faculty of Law at HKU is also the celebration of the 40th year of introducing the best legal education in Hong Kong. The Faculty was established with categorically clear goals to offer legal education comparable to the best in the world, to develop the laws of Hong Kong, to strengthen the Hong Kong legal system, and to uphold the rule of law as one of the cornerstones for the success of our economy. Since the resumption of sovereignty of Hong Kong by China, the law school has also played a significant role in the modernisation of the legal system and culture in China through the teaching of common law. It was best encapsulated by Professor Johannes Chan, Dean of the Faculty of Law, at one of his recent interviews with the *South China Morning Post* :

“There is always a sense of mission... We have the duty to contribute to the upholding of the rule of law in Hong Kong and contribute to the development of the rule of law in China. We are more than just a teaching institution. We have a peculiar role to play and we would be failing our duty not to meet those challenges.”

The rule of law is essentially a concept germinated and firmly entrenched in the Western political and social value systems. When it comes to the transplantation of the concept and practice of rule of law onto Asian soil, there are indeed not many success stories to tell. Hong Kong is one of the very few successful stories, and the rule of law has proved to be one of the pillars of the territory’s success and one of the most prized values of the Hong Kong community. Without overstating the case, the Faculty of Law has produced graduates who have flourished as prominent members of the legal profession and the judiciary, in serving the community and disseminating legal knowledge to the public, and in its participation in and contribution to important political and social developments in Hong Kong. In the last ten years, the Faculty has also been training promising young Mainland scholars and judges in common law.

Passing the Torch:

Nurturing Generations of Lawyers in Hong Kong and the Mainland

Most people may think that the law is about a set of rules. In fact, it is no less about people than any other profession. And it is also about the quality of the people in the profession. It is the quality of the people working in the system which matters most at the end of the day.

The rule of law and the independence of the legal system rely significantly on the quality of the lawyers and judges in making sure that the system is truly independent, and that the rule of law is at the heart of the actions they take and the decisions they make everyday. More than half of the current legal practitioners in Hong Kong are graduates of our Faculty of Law. Graduates of our Faculty have flourished and made immense contributions to the three major arms of the legal community in Hong Kong – the solicitors’ profession and the barristers’ profession in practice, lawyers in the Government, and the Judiciary. The last two past Presidents of the Law Society of Hong Kong and the past three Chairpersons of the Hong Kong Bar Association are all our graduates. A total of 32 of the 92 Senior Counsel in Hong Kong are our alumni. In the Judiciary, 16 judges in the Court of Final Appeal and the High Court and above also graduated from this University. The accomplishments of these graduates are probably the best testimony of the quality of the graduates we have produced.

Today, our students and graduates have continued with this fine tradition. Many of our graduates have secured employment with major law firms and chambers in Hong Kong. A good number of them have proceeded to master’s level studies at prestigious universities including Harvard, Cambridge and Oxford. Our students have been extremely active in international moot competitions and have secured awards and high rankings every year. At the end of the day, the legal profession, and legal education, is about standards and quality that can stand the test of time.

Being the only common law jurisdiction in China's civil law system, the Faculty believes it has a critical and indispensable role to play in developing common law on the Mainland and contributing to the modernisation of the Mainland's legal system. The Master of Common Law (MCL) programme was introduced in 1997 to train promising law scholars, judges and government officials in common law and to encourage the comparative study of the common law and the civil law systems in China. These students will spend one year in the Faculty, supported by scholarships, to familiarise themselves with the common law system, how decisions are made by judges and how judgments and legal principles evolve and develop. At the end of the academic year, some of these students will join the summer internship organised by the Judiciary to put into practice what they have learned.

The experience of teaching students from a completely different jurisdiction can be quite rewarding. Some MCL graduates told our teachers that, back in their courts, they are now writing longer judgments because they see the importance of judicial reasoning in deciding cases, and the reasoning has to be open to scrutiny and debate. Some of them said that they are now sitting through longer trials as they believe both sides of a case have the right to be heard (even if the prosecution is the government authorities) whereas in the past the prosecution, usually the government authorities, would be assumed to be correct. Some other graduates have followed the common law tradition to collate the decisions of administrative/regulatory bodies and publish them as official records so that they can be used as guidance for future references. Graduates who are academics have written more on the comparative study between common law and civil law, and some of them have published on common law. They may well be individual instances, but they represent the seeds that we have planted in the Mainland legal system, and we trust that in time the seeds will grow to their full bloom.



By 2009, the Faculty has trained over 500 judges, government officials, and scholars/graduates from the Mainland through our MCL programmes. Many others came as short-term visitors, and the Faculty admits about 10 undergraduate Mainland students each year through the Mainland matriculation system from a pool of about 12,000 applicants.

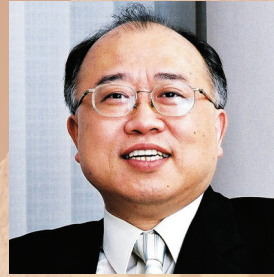

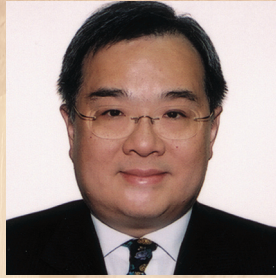

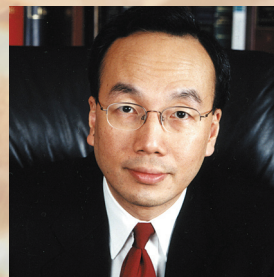

Making “Access to the Law” a Reality

The rule of law can only be upheld if it is something that everyone in the community subscribes to, and indeed, internalises as our core values.

Law is about the people it serves. How firmly the rule of law can take root in a community can sometimes be measured by the accessibility of the law to the public and how much the public understands about the law. Legal education is therefore not just about our own students and graduates, or even about the professionals. An independent legal system can only be strengthened if everyone plays a part. The rule of law can only be upheld if it is something that everyone in the community subscribes to, and indeed, internalises as our core values. As Mr Justice Learned Hand so nicely put it, *“It lies in the hearts of men and women, when it dies there, no constitution, no law, no court can save it. While it lies there, it needs no constitution, no law, no court to save it.”*

Since 2001, the Faculty’s Law and Technology Centre has run the Hong Kong Legal Information Institute (HKLII) database which offers free access to updated Hong Kong legislation, cases and other important legal information, such as Law Reform Commission’s Reports, for anyone who needs to consult such information. The number of hits on the Hong Kong Legal Information Institute (HKLII) database has increased from 15,170,951 in 2006 to 27,680,465 in 2007, and to 48,308,266 in 2008.

As a further step to disseminate legal knowledge to the general public, the Centre, together with the Department of Justice of the HKSAR, established the Community Legal Information Centre (CLIC), which provides to the general public basic information of the law in selected areas in layman language. The CLIC focuses on areas close to the daily life of the ordinary public, like conveyancing, landlord and tenants, consumer complaints, employment and labour issues, family disputes, anti-discrimination and immigration.

The Faculty plans to establish a legal clinic, and a pilot scheme was introduced in early 2009 where a group of our students work in the Small Claims Tribunal, under the supervision of academics and teachers qualified to practise, to offer assistance to claimants. The idea is, on one hand, to allow students to apply what they have learned in classrooms to real cases and, on the other hand, to provide free legal services to members of the public. Experience in the legal clinic very often can help cultivate a sense of duty and service among law students and graduates, which is extremely important to their future career and professional development.

At the same time, our students regularly organised law exhibitions and talks in the community. As a further step to make the law and legal education accessible, the Faculty is making many of its public lectures by distinguished legal scholars and judges available to the world through its webpage.

A Global Law School

In an increasingly globalised world, the Faculty must reach out in order to maintain its competitiveness internationally. In terms of research collaboration, we have partnered with Stanford University, MIT and other international partners in the Creative Commons Corporation. Other international projects have been carried out with the Australian Institute of Criminology, the Asia-Pacific Business Regulation Group at Monash University, Amsterdam Centre for International Law and the Oxford University Press, as well as the OpenNet Initiative including Harvard, Cambridge, Oxford and Toronto.

In terms of teaching and learning, partnering up with the best universities in the world will surely further enhance our standards and quality. The Faculty has been active in collaborating with prominent overseas universities to develop joint academic programmes. A five-year double degree programme of JD and LLB was recently established with the University of British Columbia. Zurich University collaborates with us at the level of the master's programme, which allows students to gain both the LLM from HKU and the MLaw from Zurich within two years. The double LLB programme with King's College London (KCL) allows students to spend two years at KCL and the remaining three years at HKU to obtain the LLB from HKU and the LLB from KCL in five years.

In terms of Greater China networks, the Faculty, together with prominent universities in the Mainland, Taiwan and Macau have been taking turn to organise annual conferences in respective venues to compare the different legal jurisdictions and the latest legal developments among the four places.

The Faculty also holds annual or biannual symposiums with the National University of Singapore, the University of New South Wales and Peking University. It also has student exchange relationships with about 180 universities in the world. Every year, the Faculty sends about 25 per

cent of its students overseas and, in return, hosts about 100 incoming exchange students from all over the world.

The HKU Faculty of Law is one of the 13 founding members of the Asian Legal Institute (ASLI) which has over 40 members including prominent universities in Singapore, Australia, Japan and some US universities. The 6th ASLI conference, which was hosted by HKU in May 2009, was regarded by all ASLI participants as setting a new high threshold for the quality of the papers presented.



In 2004, the Faculty was designated by the WTO as its first official partner in Asia to run a WTO Regional Trade Policy Course (RTPC) for government officials of 31 countries in the Asia Pacific region.

As the second phase of the RTPC programme, trade law experts in our Faculty have been offering training programmes in various countries in Southeast Asia, including Vietnam, Cambodia and Thailand, and advising their governments on trade law and policy issues.

At home, the 80 academic staff of the Faculty come from 17 jurisdictions, bringing with them diverse experience and human network, and creating a truly global environment at the Faculty.

Beyond Academia

Many members of the Faculty have served on the Law Reform Commission in their respective areas of expertise, including privacy, securities reform, civil justice reform and others. Many others serve on various public bodies or voluntary organisations. Our Centre for Comparative and Public Law has been intensely engaged in issues of anti-discrimination and equality in terms of submissions to the Government and discussion and consultation with the Legco Panel.

The Faculty has been vocal in commenting on controversial legal and political issues in the territory, notably on issues like Article 23 legislation and national security,

immigration and right of abode in Hong Kong, as well as constitutional and political reforms in the territory. These are issues of great concern among the general public and the Faculty has not failed to live up to its role of offering independent and considered views and comments both to the Government and the community at large.



Our New Habitat

HKU and the Faculty have benefited greatly from a very generous HK\$400 million donation from Dr Cheng Yu-tung. The new law building on the Centennial Campus will be named after Dr Cheng Yu-tung in recognition of his generosity in supporting the development of the Faculty of Law and the University's campus development. It is anticipated that the new law building will be ready by 2012, and students will benefit from the integrated design and modern facilities, including venues for mooted competitions and training, advocacy laboratories, well-supported research workstations and facilities for our research students, and general state-of-the-art teaching and learning facilities. We are looking forward to moving to our new home!

不經不覺在大學已工作了近二十五個年頭，在學院工作，特別感到時光消逝，尤其是近年當上院長，每年暑假剛送別一批同學，幾星期後又會迎接新一屆入學的同學，春秋往復，就這樣看着一代一代年輕人的成長。

偶爾會收到一兩位剛畢業的同學的謝卡(近年則以電郵代替)，當中有感懷在大學的數年韶光，有談到在學習時所得到的啟發。曾經有一位同學，一年級時在我的導修小組，當時充滿年輕人的理想，但也有一點心散，成績她不算是最突出，但總散發一份熱誠。畢業後往美國深造，然後回港工作，她一直和我保持聯繫，每隔一陣子總會收到她寄來的明信片，訴說她的近況。畢業多年，每年聖誕還會收到她的賀卡。也有一位來自內地的學生，第一年在港大遇上很多適應上的問題，和她傾談了多次，鼓勵她努力面對逆境，畢業後她拿了獎學金往英國深造，現在的工作穿梭於中港兩地之間，每隔一段日子還會收到她的來信訴說近況，秀麗的鋼筆字，親切的文詞，這已遠勝於任何教育評核，也是當老師最大的回報。

不少早年畢業的同學，今天已成為好朋友。當年是師生，現在是閒話家常，談談兒女學業的朋友，當中也有一些成為自己的同事。前一陣子在一宗官司中與一位以前教過的學生合作，看到他事業有成，那份能幹穩重與隨日子而來的成熟，實在感到欣慰，也得同時告誡自己，學問或專業，均是學無止境，長江後浪推前浪，不進則退。

曾經有個學生告訴我，上課教他的東西他已大部分忘得一乾二淨，但倒是我課堂外的言論和公共服務給他帶來更多的啟發。他記得我曾說過，人生中除金錢與名利外，總還會有一些值得我們追尋的東西，於是，他毅然放棄加入律師行列，而去追尋自己的理想。也有一位跟我做論文來自尼泊爾的學生，每天總想著如何改變他國家的命運，每次會面我們均談到不少關於憲法人權的理念，回國後他出任調查失踪人士專案小組的召集人，為不少因維護法治人權而失踪的人士平反，每次的電郵總洋溢著他對明天的希望。

China Earthquake: HKU Action

In response to the Sichuan Earthquake in 2008, the HKU community has been involved in various voluntary projects in which the University possesses expertise.

With donations from alumni and the community, the University has set aside some internal seed funding for its academic colleagues to engage in research and service-oriented initiatives in the earthquake-affected areas. Training, Service, Reflection

It is not only academic colleagues who are leading various projects in Sichuan, students are also involved through HKU service learning programmes. Service learning is a pedagogical method in which students learn through active participation in structured community service programmes, which consist of training, service and reflection.

New Opportunity to Serve

Gallant Ho Service Learning Scheme – Family Values 何耀棟服務學習計劃 - 家庭價值 was established in September 2009 with a HK\$5 million donation from Dr Gallant Ho 何耀棟 (BA 1965). This five-year scheme aims to provide service learning opportunities for 500 HKU students to serve the community and their experiences will be part of the new four-year undergraduate curriculum. Students will experience and reflect on the family values embedded in the Chinese culture while, at the same time, contributing to the well-being of the community.

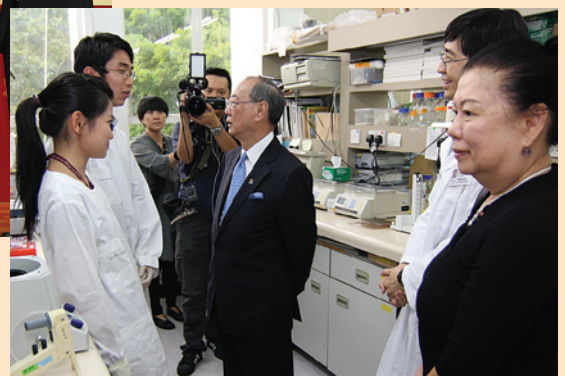

Fuelling Hong Kong's Cultural Dynamism

Mr Frank Proctor, founder and publisher of *Muse* magazine, has been a long-time supporter of the Journalism and Media Studies Centre (JMSC). He provided practical support to establish the JMSC Young Journalist Scholarship Fund in 2003. In addition, his magazine offers internship and job opportunities to JMSC students and graduates.

More recently, JMSC saw the establishment of the ***Muse Magazine Distinguished Lecture Series in the Humanities*** conducted by Professor Leo Lee 李歐梵教授* and the ***Muse Magazine Critic-in-Residence Programme***.

Mr Proctor tells us more about these new initiatives:

Q: What motivated you to sponsor the Distinguished Lecture Series in the Humanities?

A: Professor Leo Lee is one of the most brilliant and original thinkers in Hong Kong today and his work has long been widely recognised in the Chinese Mainland, Taiwan, and the United States as well as in Hong Kong.

While his experience and outlook are thoroughly cosmopolitan, he is keenly aware of place and is truly able to put Hong Kong's unique local condition in perspective. And I think the Distinguished Lecture Series is an ideal forum for Professor Lee to put forward his thought-provoking perspectives to the wider community.

Q: Which aspects of Professor Lee's lectures do you see as particularly engaging for global citizens in the 21st Century?

A: The breadth of topics that Professor Lee will cover – from literature and film to philosophy, music and architecture – are inspiring. He is a master at drawing surprising, hidden connections among ideas and art forms.

Q: What brought about the idea of the sponsorship for Critic-in-Residence programme?

A: My experience as publisher convinced me that the city needs to cultivate more good arts critics who write in an intelligent way for a general audience. The main role of the Critic-in-Residence will be to teach students at JMSC about writing on arts and culture, with an emphasis on reviews and criticism. We hope that he or she can spark a discussion about the role and practice of arts criticism that will excite the city as a whole.

唐宋遺音 — 港大古琴研究計劃

琴是中國歷史最悠久的樂器，現代稱為『古琴』或『七絃琴』。在兩千多年的傳承中，琴不僅創造並完善了獨特的琴器、琴曲、琴譜，更因其深沉高雅的音韻與豐富的藝術表現力，成為中華民族精神的代表。孔子就精通琴學；《禮記》中也說『士無故不撤琴瑟』；魏晉名士嵇康更在《琴賦》中讚揚『眾器之中，琴德最優』。

自2003年被聯合國教科文組織列為「人類非物質文化遺產」以來，古琴的文化價值已經得到廣泛認同。有鑒於此，香港大學致力於以『唐宋遺音』為核心的琴學研究工作，由港大人文基金贊助，從一磚一石奠定扎實的基礎，數年來會同牛津大學、東京藝術大學、柏林民族學博物館、美國國家亞洲藝術博物館，開展了對日藏唐傳古琴譜寫本的數碼化，美藏唐宋琴器的CT掃描等一系列國際學術合作。

The **HKU Qin Project**, sponsored by the HKU Culture and Humanities Fund, aims to be the hub of collaborative research into *qin* and *qin* music. A series of research projects has been carried out on this significant part of China's heritage in collaboration with internationally recognised authorities. In 2003, UNESCO proclaimed *qin* music as a masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity.

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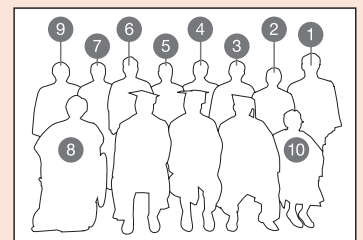

RMB, Present and Future

After the Ordinary General Meeting, Dr Cui Li 崔歷, Head (External) of the Hong Kong Monetary Authority, shared with Convocation members her views on the RMB's role in the present and in the future.

Cui said that the RMB has become more free compared with ten years ago yet there are many restrictions remaining, such as limited convertibility for capital account transactions and official trade settlement, which is permitted in hard currencies only.

Cui also shared with the audience how Hong Kong has been a testing ground for the initiatives of using the RMB outside the Mainland and has developed the capacity to handle RMB transactions; hence, she believes Hong Kong is well positioned to handle a large part of the offshore RMB business and to enhance the international status of the RMB in future.

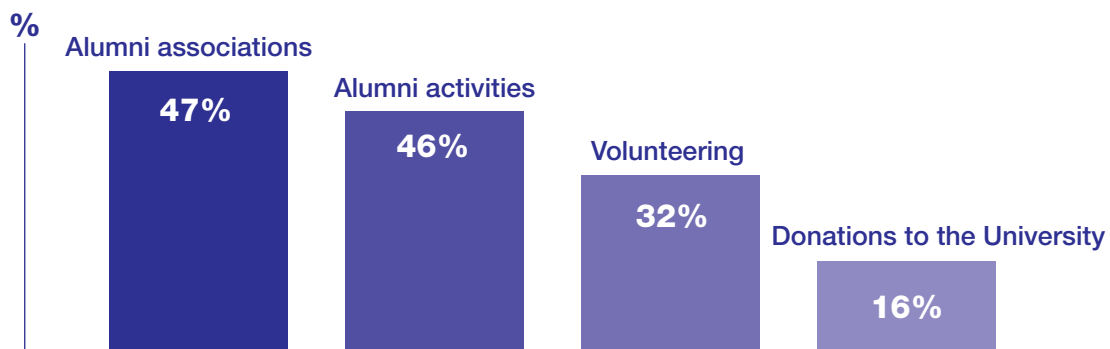

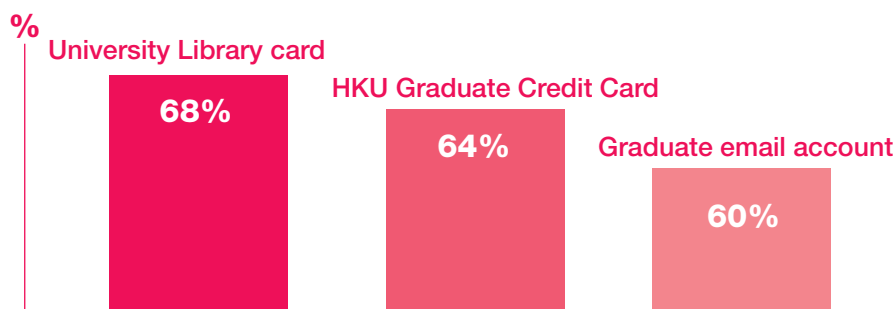

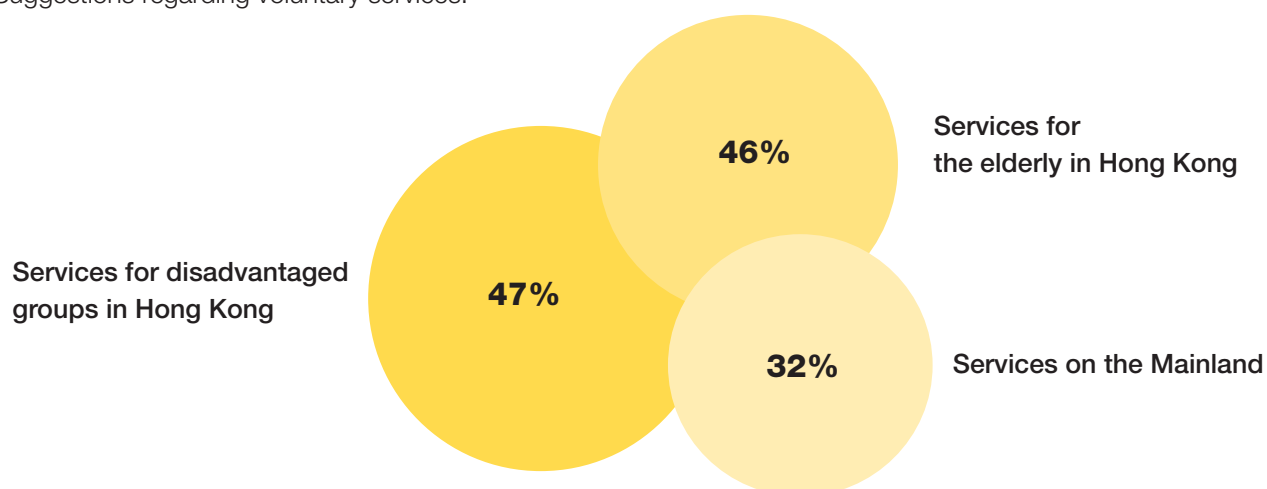

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Pathology Genes Run in

A Pioneering Pathologist

Professor Hou Pao-chang 侯寶璋 was Chair of Pathology at HKU between 1948 and 1960.

His principal research interest lay in the area of hepatobiliary diseases and he was well known for his work on the relationship between the Chinese liver fluke, *Clonorchis sinensis* and cancer of the bile ducts.

As The University of Hong Kong struggled to rehabilitate itself after the second world war, Hou took up the responsibility of guiding the Department of Pathology into the modern era of scientific investigation. During his headship, a new pathology building was constructed at Queen Mary Hospital in 1958, integrating teaching, research and clinical services.

Hou was a disciplinarian. He was deeply concerned about the learning attitude of students and believed strongly that a good pathologist has to be inquisitive and thorough, even to the degree of being obsessive.

After retiring from HKU, Hou was invited to be Vice-President of the Chinese Medical College 中國醫科大學, a post he held until his passing in 1967.

A True Patriot

Professor Hou Jiancun 侯健存, the second son of Hou Pao-chang, studied at HKU medical school in 1949 and became a demonstrator in the Department of Pathology. In 1952, he returned to China as a researcher at the Central Institute of Health 中央衛生研究院, the predecessor of the Chinese Academy of Medical Sciences 中國醫學科學院, and became Chair of Pathology at Peking Union Medical College 中國協和醫科大學 in 1985.

He has dedicated his life's work to the greater good of China by fostering the development of medical science and building bridges between Western science and Chinese traditions.

He is also one of the founders of the HKU Alumni Association of Chinese Mainland.

A Passionate Son

The pathology gene also runs in Professor Hou's fourth son, Professor Laurence Hou Lee-tsun 侯勵存 (MBBS 1956). Laurence received his PhD from the University of Leeds in 1965 and was conferred the Honorary Degree of LLD by the University of Aberdeen in 1997. He is now the Regius Permanent Lecturer at the University of Aberdeen, the Head of Histopathology and Cytology Division at the Hong Kong Sanatorium & Hospital, and Honorary Professor of the Department of Pathology at HKU.

In 2007, forty years after his father's passing, Laurence launched the "Hou Pao-Chang Medical Memorial Fund" 侯寶璋醫學紀念基金 to support teaching and research in the Department of Pathology, HKU.

"In 1957, Madam Yuen So-moy 袁蘇妹, a young mother of three, joined her husband to run the University Hall kitchen. Little did she know that she was to have an enjoyable career there for the rest of her working life. Affectionately known to U Hallites as 三嫂 ("Sam So" or "Auntie Three"), she served U Hall ceaselessly to the day she retired in 1998. Her official job titles – Cook IV, Assistant Cook and Hall Attendant – belie the importance of her contributions to the Hall and to HKU over four decades.

She assumed the role of a kindly maternal figure – preparing special meals for the ill and offering solace or encouragement whenever needed. She contributed to higher education in the most fundamental of ways: by nurturing, sustaining and strengthening the emotional well-being of generations of U Hallites. She demonstrated one can, regardless of one's rank and simply with dedication to one's job, make a genuine difference to other people. Her devotion to the Hall has not wavered since her retirement as she returns to the Hall regularly to encourage the new U Hallites and tell them the standards and ideals they should aspire to.

The Students' Association at U Hall elected her an Honorary Member in 1990. The University made an unprecedented formal recognition of her invaluable contribution by the presentation of an Honorary University Fellowship to her on September 22, 2009. Thus tells the legend."

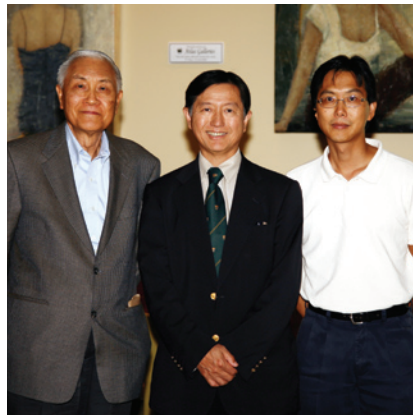

羅慷烈教授於一九四零年畢業於廣州中山大學文學院中文系，一直從事中文教育。曾任香港培正中學教師和羅富國師範學院講師，一九六六年起在香港大學中文系任教，直至一九八三年退休。

羅教授對中國古典詩、詞、曲的研究，在香港和國內學術界，無人不知。羅教授對經、史、文字學、音韻學等，都有極高的造詣，因此他曾多次在香港大學講授《周易》、《尚書》、《三家詩》、《春秋三傳》等。

羅教授著述甚豐，分別在國內、香港和台灣出版。其中《元曲三百首箋》一書，面世以來，一直為兩岸三地多間大學的指定參考讀物。單篇論文數量逾六十篇，散見於國內和香港的一級學術雜誌和論文集，備受學術界重視。

Professor Lo Hong-lit, one of the most revered classical Chinese scholars, passed away on June 12, 2009 at the age of 95.

Professor Lo joined the Department of Chinese, HKU in 1966 and retired in 1983. He was held in high regard within academia, first and foremost for his achievements in classical Chinese poetry spanning from the *shi* of the Tang Dynasty to the *ci* of the Song Dynasty and the *qu* of the Yuan Dynasty. His wide-ranging scholarship extended beyond poetry to the Confucian classics, Chinese history and historiography, different philosophical traditions and the great anthologies, as well as classical philology and phonology.

A prolific and versatile researcher, Professor Lo was author of over sixty monographs published in leading journals and reputable collections.

翰墨因緣

何文匯教授

(BA 1969; MPhil 1972)

今年六月十九日，羅師母和女公子羅賁如律師、子婿、哲嗣羅鳴謙教授會同四位羅老師的學生——單周堯教授、鄧昭祺教授、黃媽梨教授和我，商討羅老師的喪禮事宜。師母並且囑咐我今天用十分鐘，就我的個人經歷，略述羅老師的軼事。

羅老師和我都在一九六六年加入香港大學，羅老師任教職，我入讀本科一年級。當時中學生大都要讀羅老師和其他兩位先生合編的《新編國文》；所以羅老師的大名，在學界幾乎無人不知。

我還記得一九六六年夏天某日，我去港大選科，走進中文系辦公室，在幾位指導老師面前填寫表格。其中一位容止閑雅的中年老師一邊看著我填寫表格，一邊稱讚我的鋼筆字寫得好；繼而問我是不是常常寫毛筆字。我說不是。跟著還說，多寫毛筆字也不一定寫得好字，我的鄉先輩康有為常常寫毛筆字，可是他的字還是寫得不好。這位老師對我如此狂妄的態度不但不以為忤，反而莞爾而笑。我當時還未知道和我談話的，就是鼎鼎大名的羅懋烈先生；亦想不到，由當日開始，我們便結下永遠的、密切的師生關係。

我就讀本科時，立志磨去主角，於是請羅老師賜我「衣錦尚褻」四字墨寶，作為座右銘。羅老師並不吝嗇筆墨，竟然寫了「衣錦尚褻，惡其文之著也。故君子之道闡然而日章」二十個字，以積極的語調收筆。反而最驚心動魄的「小人之道之然而日亡」就不寫，讓我自己去領略。羅老師誨人之道，由此可見一斑。

我做哲學碩士研究生時，羅老師是我的導師。除了對我循循善誘之外，又容許我晚上用他的辦公室寫論文。羅老師更邀請美國威斯康辛大學東亞語言文學系主任、漢學大師周策縱教授作為我的校外考試委員，間接使我得以在一九七四年從倫敦前往威斯康辛大學教書，大大增廣我的見聞。當我在外國的時候，羅老師的航空郵柬和信件亦經常降臨英國和美國，為我解答學術和處世的問題。

一九七一年，我從香港去英國倫敦攻讀博士學位。當時居室患鼠，令我感到非常苦惱。羅老師寫信告訴我，日軍侵華期間，他隨校西遷，途中曾經作七律一首，現在只記得「三更穴鼠嚙枯壁，五夜長歌缺唾壺」一聯。提議我不妨足成一首新的七律，分散我對鼠輩的注意力。我於是報以七律一首：「每披黃卷見鴻儒，陋室能藏術士徒。氣有大剛閑處養，心方偏遠一城孤。三更穴鼠嚙枯壁，五夜長歌缺唾壺。貞得幽人且無悶，漫天狂雪易迷途。」羅老師回信說，詩寫得好，不過就帶點「頭巾氣」。此語使我茅塞頓開，對於作詩之道，又有了更深了解。可見羅老師教誨後學的成功處，全在乎因勢利導。而我亦因而終身受益。

羅老師溫文爾雅，從來不對學生頤指氣使。〈中庸〉記載孔子的話：「寬柔以教，不報無道，南方之強也，君子居之。」羅老師正是行「南方之強」。同時，羅老師「和而不流，中立而不倚」，亦是行古人所謂「中國之強」；所以學生都樂於追隨左右，受其身教。我們亦由此目睹羅老師「體漸弱」而「志彌堅」，因之深受感動。

羅府在樓房平地的一層，不過從樓房大門到家門要上三級台階，平時不用兩秒鐘便上完。但是，羅老師在今年五月已經要左手握台階扶手，右手握手杖支撐，並要由人攙扶，舉步難艱，用了大約一分鐘才上完三級台階，實在非常吃力。但當他返回家裡，坐在椅上，依然心境開朗，依然談笑風生。如此豁達的胸襟，令我們肅然起敬。

六月十日，羅師母打電話給我，說鳴謙從美國回來度假，羅老師想約我一起吃午飯。我們於是約定在六月十一日見面。當日，羅老師雙腳已經完全無力，不要說上下台階，連踏平地都不可能。所以我們外出吃午飯，羅老師要由鳴謙抱上車和抱下車，其他時候就以汽車和輪椅代步。席上，羅老師仍然興致勃勃。當時大家並沒有料到西苑酒家的午飯竟然是羅老師今生最後的午飯。十多個小時後，羅老師就在睡眠中考終厥命，重歸仙籍，而典範就從此長留人間。

雖然仙凡未必同道，但我深信羅老師仙班重列，俯瞰凡塵，目睹親朋相送，亦必有所感。我的回憶，少不免會引起各位致祭嘉賓的回憶。今天，就讓我們以回憶作為羅老師的送別禮物。

Professor Sir Harry Fang 方心讓 (MBBS 1949; Hon LLD 1977)

Professor Sir Harry Fang, also known as “Father of Rehabilitation” 復康之父, passed away on August 24, 2009 at the age of 86.

*The world is a poorer place for his passing,
but a better place for his having been here.*

“A man who lived a life filled with compassion for others, Professor Fang added to the sum of human happiness. Highly esteemed and revered by his students, colleagues and friends, this kind, caring, gentle man will be sadly missed and will long be remembered for his invaluable contributions to orthopaedic medicine, social and rehabilitation services, and his profound legacy which is found in the body of work into which he poured his heart.

One cannot overstate the impact he had on orthopaedic medicine and rehabilitation in Hong Kong and the Mainland. From his earliest significant contribution to orthopaedic surgery, which was known internationally as the “Hong Kong Operation” for the treatment of skeletal tuberculosis, to the founding of orthopaedic departments at hospitals and rehabilitation centres across Hong Kong, Professor Fang fought valiantly to ease the suffering of his patients. He felt that children in particular suffered the most and, in 1959, he co-founded the Hong Kong Society for Rehabilitation and began building a home in Sandy Bay for convalescing children, now the Duchess of Kent Children’s Orthopaedic Hospital. He was instrumental in formulating rehabilitation policies aimed at not only improvements for the disadvantaged but also social integration.”

He was a ‘giant’ among men who will continue to inspire many and to improve the lives of others as his memory will continue to live on in all our hearts. The members of the Department express their deepest condolences to Professor Fang’s family.”

Corazon Conjuangco Aquino, the 11th President of the Philippines, passed away on August 1, 2009 at the age of 76.



Cory, as she was affectionately called, received her education in the Philippines and the United States. She married her husband Ninoy in 1954 and they had five children together. When Ninoy was assassinated in 1983, Cory declared that she was “widowed of a man but remained wedded to his cause”; the cause was to unite the nation and bring it peace.

In 1986, Cory led the “people power” revolution that instigated the toppling of Ferdinand Marcos from power. In the six years that followed, her administration fought for the ideals of a democratic Philippines and worked hard to grapple with problems such as poverty and social injustice.

Of herself, Cory once said: “I have not always won, but, to the very end, I never shirked a fight and did not lose the last one.”

This valiant fighter and reluctant leader saw the founding of a new republic and will be remembered as a president who not only overthrew an unconstitutional and tyrannical regime but also led a transition which reinstated a democratic government in the Philippines.

In 1993, she was conferred the Degree of Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa* by HKU for her contributions to cherishing the ideals of democratic principles.



Professor Jimmy Chan 陳永昌

(BSc 1960; MA(Ed) 1969)

Professor Chan passed away on May 27, 2009, at the age of 74.

Professor Chan was a loyal and true friend to the University. He was a member of the Standing Committee (1960-1973), Clerk (1973-1979), Deputy Chairman (1979-1993) of Convocation, and Member of the Court (1973-1993) of the University.

After graduating from HKU, Professor Chan pursued his Doctoral degree at the University of London; then went to the University of Melbourne to undertake postdoctoral research study before returning to Hong Kong.

Professor Chan devoted himself to the development of psychology in Hong Kong and the Mainland, rising in the ranks of his profession to become one of Hong Kong's most prominent psychologists. He helped to establish the Hong Kong Psychological Society and was elected Fellow of the Society in 1982 and later President in 1993.

Professor Peter B Harris

Professor Harris passed away on July 28, 2009.

Professor Harris was awarded the position of Chair Professor in the Department of Political Science at The University of Hong Kong in January 1970 and remained in the post for twenty years until his retirement in June 1989. Upon his retirement he was awarded the position of Professor Emeritus.

As head of the Department, he was instrumental in developing successful courses both at undergraduate and postgraduate level; in particular, he introduced the highly regarded Master of Public Administration programme which trained many future leaders in government and other areas of the public sector.

Professor Harris held two doctoral degrees and was the University Orator for Honorary Degrees. He was author of a number of texts and published widely in journals in the fields of Public Administration, corruption and Political Science. He taught undergraduate students as well as graduates throughout his career and is remembered fondly by many of these alumni.

Within the Hong Kong community Peter was often asked for his thoughts on television and radio, briefed the Hong Kong government on Hong Kong's future and also lectured to officers in the British armed forces.

Yvonne Chiu 趙鄧人翹

Yvonne passed away on September 27, 2009, at the age of 65.

Yvonne was the resident tutor of Lady Ho Tung Hall from 1966-68. In 1974, she moved with her family to Toronto where she became a lecturer and associate professor in Microbiology & Genetics at the University of Toronto, Scarborough campus. She remained at the University for over 30 years and was named as one of its Great Minds on the occasion of its 175th anniversary in 2002.

She was an influential and proud member of the Chinese-Canadian community in Toronto. Most notably she was Chair of Fundraising for the Mon Sheong Foundation; co-founder of the Chinese Cultural Centre of Greater Toronto, in Markham, Ontario; Chairperson of the Cathay Pavilion at the Metro Toronto Caravan, and founder of the Education Foundation of the Federation of Chinese Canadian Professionals (Ontario) together with her husband John Chiu 趙洪鏘 (MBBS 1966). In 2001, she was recognised for her outstanding service to the country when she was named a Member of the Order of Canada.
