About Professor Lap-Chee Tsui:

Professor Tsui was born in Shanghai and awarded his bachelor and master degrees from the Chinese University of Hong Kong, PhD degree from the University of Pittsburgh.

He received international acclaim in 1989 when he identified the defective gene (viz. Cystic Fibrosis Transmembrane Regulator (CFTR)) that causes cystic fibrosis, which is a major breakthrough in human genetics. Professor Tsui has received numerous international awards and honours over the years.

Professor Tsui was Geneticist-in-Chief and Head of Genetics and Genomic Biology Program of the Research Institute, The Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto, and H.E. Sellers Chair in Cystic Fibrosis and University Professor at the University of Toronto. He is also the Immediate Past President of HUGO, the international organisation of scientists involved in the Human Genome Project.

He was the Chairman of the Biology and Medicine Panel of the Research Grants Council of the University Grants Committee of Hong Kong during 1994-2001. He is the Consultant to the setting up of the Genome Centre of HKU, and the Chairman of the Steering Committee on that Centre.

HKU Gets the Top Students in SAR and the Mainland

Like in the past years, HKU gets the most HKALE Grade-A1 students (in 2 AL subjects and 1 AS subject in Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination). The number of these Grade-A1 students admitted to HKU is more than the total sum of those admitted by all other local institutions.

Furthermore, the University has admitted 60 "Fee-paying" Mainland students. A total of 1,006 applications were received from Shanghai, Beijing, Guangdong, Fujian, Jiangsu and Zhejiang. The University originally intended to admit about 30

students. But in view of the very high quality of the applicants, it finally decided to expand the number to 60.

Like those Mainland students admitted under previous Jockey Club Scholarship scheme (now Government Scholarship scheme), these 60 students will spend their first year in one of the following institutions: Peking University, Fudan University, Nanjing University, Tsinghua University, Sun Yat Sen University, or Xiamen University before they start their studies in HKU in the year 2003-2004.

After more than 22 years of service at the University of Hong Kong, Professor Ian Davies retired and becomes the Advisor to the Vice-Chancellor's Office now till early next year.

Members of Convocation bid a farewell to him on August 21 at the China Tee Club.
