

## Mother Teresa 德蘭修女 (Hon DSocSc 1993)

A beatification mass for Mother Teresa, the Calcutta nun, in Vatican City on October 19, was attended by a crowd of more than 150,000. Mother Teresa received the degree of Doctor of Social Sciences, honoris causa, from the University in 1993. She died in 1997.

"... Mother Teresa loves India and India adores her. Since her arrival in Calcutta in 1946, the city has been plagued by destruction, ignorance, class prejudice and religious strikes. ...

> In the slums of Calcutta, the Missionary of Charity establishes homes and orphanages for the unwanted, the homeless and for crippled and mentally-retarded children.

Clinics for the malnourished and rehabilitation centers for lepers, drug addicts and alcoholics set the example

for sisters of the Order all over the world to follow...."
