

# A Record Breaking and Auspicious Beginning



# HONG KONG UNIVERSITY ALUMNI ASSOCIATION, MALAYSIA

29th November, 2005

Dear Mr Vice-Chancellor Professor Tsui

First of all, we wish to thank you for inviting us to your Lodge for lunch, which we presume will be a sumptuous one. Also, we wish to tell you how happy we all are to come back to our Alma Mater in what can be called a "homecoming" event. It brings back memories of the good old days and reminds us of the song 'One day when we were young".

As you know, Malaysia had a very close relationship with the University. In my time in the 1930s, I remember in St. John's Hall, where I stayed, about half of the students were from Malaya and Singapore, while there were even more in Eliot & Lugard Halls. When I was once the president of the Pan Malaysian Alumni Association about 30 years ago, the membership of the Association reached almost 200...

...we are proud that our Alma Mater has grown from strength to strength in the last few decades. Hong Kong is situated geographically at the cultural hub where the East meets the West. Now that China is emerging as a world power, HKU's role in education will be even more important.

The University is especially important to us in Malaysia, because of its proximity to South
East Asia, which is fast becoming a significant region in the world. Also our parents prefer to
send their children to a good university near home.

Mr Vice-Chancellor, we thank you for giving us the opportunity to air our views on Malaysia students gaining admission into our Alma Mater. We hope our request will receive your serious attention. It is our understanding that you may visit Malaysia in the near future, and we are looking forward to your arrival.

He explained to the alumni that in the centennial blueprint, internationalisation is one of the top priorities of HKU and agreed that despite the restrictions of the government and the funding constraints, HKU will work hard to recruit more international students which will surely include those from Malaysia.

**T**KUGA College, a new secondary school set up by Hong HKong University Graduates Association Education Foundation under the Direct Subsidy Scheme ("DSS"), will open in September 2006. Forming the "through-train" DSS school model with HKUGA Primary School, there will be five classes of Secondary One (S1) for the school year 2006-2007. Applications for S1 will be accepted from December 3, 2005 onwards.

The College, situated on Nam Fung Road, Wong Chuk Hang, is built along the scenic landscape and is well equipped with state-of-the-art facilities. The vision of the College is to nurture students to become responsible citizens and leaders of tomorrow who are committed to serve with "vision, culture, ideals, commitment and dedication to excellence".

A school-based curriculum designed for S1 to S4 aims at enriching the students' learning experiences, addressing their evolving needs and focusing on their competence requirements



at various developmental stages. References will be made to incorporate the best educational practices in Hong Kong and overseas. For the senior years S5 and S6, the Diploma Programme of the International Baccalaureate Organization will be adopted.

#### Women on a 'row'!

The Oxford-Cambridge rowing regatta ■ has captured worldwide attention since 1829. Hong Kong also followed this grand example since 1986 and every year elite rowers from Chinese University of Hong Kong and the University of Hong Kong challenge each other over a 4 km

race. The Intervarsity Rowing Championship (IRC) has since catapulted itself into the limelight of annual sports glamour events in Hong Kong for both men and women alike.

Rowing began at the university when Hong Kong needed a rowing team for the Asian Games and the University has since become its main source of rower selection. The sport initially was more popular within the Faculty of Dentistry, with both staff and students participating. It was not until 1986 when the first IRC was established did the sport grow in its stature across the university. Women race started from the third IRC.

From the public viewpoint, rowing is synonymous with muscularity, which in fact is not true. Rowing is a sport aimed at technique, power and endurance. The key is all about balancing the boat and the mind. This balance is especially critical while synchronising with all team-mates in and out of the boat.

The Ordinary General Meeting 2005 of Convocation 香港大 學畢業生議會 was held on lune 17 in the Convocation Room, HKU. It is an annual event for all Convocation members (i.e. HKU graduates) to meet and share. At the Meeting, Mr Andrew Fung 馮可強 (BA 1969; DipEd 1972), Ms Betty Leong 梁羡靈 (BA 1987), Mr Man Cheuk-fei 文灼非 (BA 1987), Mr Kenneth Sit 薜海華 (LLB 1980; PCLL 1981), Mr Tong Chun-wan 唐振寰 (BA[AS] 1975;

BArch 1977), Mr Patrick Tsang 曾廣海 (BScEng 1973) and Mr John Wan 温頌安 (BSc 1970) were elected, ipso facto, as members of the Standing Committee with effect from September 1, 2005 until the Ordinary General Meeting in 2008. Subsequently, Dr Albert Chau 周偉立(BScEng 1983; CertPsych 1984) was also co-opted to the Committee to fill a casual vacancy.

Professor Lung Ying-tai 龍應台教授, Visiting Professor of Journalism and Media Studies Centre, HKU was invited to speak on "Cultural Positioning of HKU 「人文港大」" in which she shared her aspirations on developing HKU's culture and humanities. Reports on her talk:

也是在這個大廳,胡適在一九三六年春天接 受了榮譽博士的學位。在胡適的推薦下,許地山 來到這裡,很艱難地,試圖把人文的學風帶進港 大。許地山去世之後,陳寅恪暫接他的工作,在 公開講座裡談魏晉史,講「秦婦吟」……

離開陸佑堂,往山上走。山徑從一株巨大的 老樟開始,林木蔥蘢,野生九重葛在濃綠之中 驚紅駭紫。這是二十年代朱光潛每天要走的山 徑。多少年後,這山徑,朱光潛説,「最使我留 戀。」再滑過二十年,女生張愛玲提著皮箱來到 這裡,但是「一個炸彈掉在我們宿舍的隔壁…… 我們聚集在宿舍的最下層,黑漆漆的箱子間裡, 只聽見機關槍『忒拉拉拍拍』像荷葉上的雨。」

站在山腰望遠,秋晚的天空清澄如洗,百年 前想必是一樣顏色照人。歷史,像這眼前的山間 小徑,深林裡千重迴旋,不知所之,不經意間卻 又在某個轉彎的地方驀然交會,青草更青。
