About the Speaker of Luncheon Talk – Mr. Patrick LAU Lai-chiu, SBS, JP

After graduation with a Bachelor of Social Sciences (Honour) Degree from the University of Hong Kong in 1972, Mr. Lau joined the Hong Kong Government civil service. His scope of work in the following 25 years spanned across Hong Kong's external trade and industrial policies, multilateral trade negotiations, training and development of civil servants, district administration and community development.

Upon the handover in 1997, Mr. Lau assumed the post of Deputy Secretary of Planning and Lands and participated in the formulation of policies and legislation on land planning, use, and administration including urban renewal, development of the West Kowloon Cultural District and the former international airport site, building maintenance, etc. He subsequently took up the post of Deputy Head and Acting Head of the Central Policy Unit of the HKSARG and participated in the compilation of the Chief Executive's Policy Address and policy research.

He assumed the post of Director of Lands in May 2002 and was responsible for overseeing implementation of the policies on management, acquisition and disposal of government land and on the sale of real estate development prior to completion. He retired as the Director of Lands in June 2007 after serving 36 years with the Government.

Mr. Lau was awarded the Silver Bauhinia Star in 2007 in recognition of his dedicated and meritorious service to the Government and the Hong Kong community, particularly in the areas of planning and lands. He is now Advisor (Private Hospital Tender Assessment) of the Food and Health Bureau, Director on the Board of the Hong Kong Countryside Foundation, Advisor of the Hong Kong Ideas Centre, Executive Committee Member of the Hong Kong Professionals & Senior Executives Association, Member of the Audit Committee of the Hong Kong Housing Society, Member of the Land, Rehousing & Compensation Committee of the Urban Renewal Authority, and Member of the Public Administration Advisory Board, Department of Politics and Public Administration, University of Hong Kong.

Mr. Lau also writes a weekly column in the Hong Kong Economic Journal on land and related issues
